7.1 Obiectivul general al disciplinei	
7.2 Obiectivele specifice	<p>Because of its status, the process of development/enlargement, the European Union can be described as a ‘negotiated order’, a ‘permanent negotiation institute’ and a ‘negotiation marathon’. The EU policy process is dependent on negotiations as a mode of reaching agreements on, and implementing, common policies. The roots of the European idea and the creation of the European community after the Second World War lie in the desire to prevent further war between European nations. One of the main goals of the original idea of European integration is defined as preserving peace in the Member States.</p> <p>Theories are important as they help us to understand how the EU works, and having a better understanding of how the EU has developed allows us to hypothesise about what the EU might be like in the future. The main objective of the discipline is to deepen the knowledge of students in the negotiation process which is the main instrument of the enlargement process. Also, the course propose to focus on future or ongoing enlargement processes, actors, instruments, and legal background. Another objective is to make students to understand the specificity of the European construction process, to acquire the knowledge regarding European integration and the mechanisms of national-European reporting through EU perspectives.</p> <p>It is also important to be familiar with the different approaches people take when explaining European integration, as whatever is written is always grounded in a particular set of assumptions which should be taken into account when reflecting on what has been said.</p>
